
EXCHANGE HOUSE IRELAND COOKIE POLICY

BACKGROUND:

This website [Exchange House Ireland National Travellers Service](#) (“Our Site”) uses Cookies and similar technologies in order to distinguish you from other users. By using Cookies, we are able to provide you with a better experience and to improve Our Site by better understanding how you use it. Please read this Cookie Policy carefully and ensure that you understand it.

Your acceptance of Our Cookie Policy is deemed to occur if you continue using Our Site.

1. Definitions and Interpretation

1.1 In this Cookie Policy, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the following meanings:

“ Cookie ”	means a small file placed on your computer or device by Our Site when you visit certain parts of Our Site and/or when you use certain features of Our Site;
“ Cookie Law ”	means the relevant parts of the Privacy and Electronic Communications (EC Directive) Regulations 2003 and Regulation 2016/679 General Data Protection Regulation (“GDPR”);
“ personal data ”	means any and all data that relates to an identifiable person who can be directly or indirectly identified from that data defined by the Data Protection Act 1998 OR EU Regulation 2016/679 General Data Protection Regulation (“GDPR”);

3. How Does Our Site Use Cookies?

- 3.1 Our Site may place and access certain first party Cookies on your computer or device. First party Cookies are those placed directly by Us and are used only by Us. We use Cookies to facilitate and improve your experience of Our Site and to provide and improve Our services. We have carefully chosen these Cookies and have taken steps to ensure that your privacy and personal data is protected and respected at all times.
- 3.2 By using Our Site, you may also receive certain third party Cookies on your computer or device. Third party Cookies are those placed by websites, services, and/or parties other than Us. Third party Cookies are used on Our Site for different purposes. For more details, please refer to section 4 below.
- 3.3 All Cookies used by and on Our Site are used in accordance with current ePrivacy rules. We may use some or all of the following types of Cookie:

4.

4.1.1 Strictly Necessary Cookies

A Cookie falls into this category if it is essential to the operation of Our Site, supporting functions such as logging in, your shopping basket, and payment transactions.

4.1.2 Analytics Cookies

It is important for Us to understand how you use Our Site, for example, how efficiently you are able to navigate around it, and what features you use. Analytics Cookies enable us to gather this information, helping Us to improve Our Site and your experience of it.

4.1.3 Functionality Cookies

Functionality Cookies enable Us to provide additional functions to you on Our Site such as personalisation and remembering your saved preferences. Some functionality Cookies may also be strictly necessary Cookies, but not all necessarily fall into that category.

4.1.4 Targeting Cookies

It is important for Us to know when and how often you visit Our Site, and which parts of it you have used (including which pages you have visited and which links you have visited). As with analytics Cookies, this information helps us to better understand you and, in turn, to make Our Site and advertising more relevant to your interests. [Some information gathered by targeting Cookies may also be shared with third parties.]

4.1.5 [Third Party Cookies

Third party Cookies are not placed by Us; instead, they are placed by third parties that provide services to Us and/or to you. Third party Cookies may be used by advertising services to serve up tailored advertising to you on Our Site, or by third parties providing analytics services to Us (these Cookies will work in the same way as analytics Cookies described above).]

4.1.6 Persistent Cookies

Any of the above types of Cookie may be a persistent Cookie. Persistent Cookies are those which remain on your computer or device for a predetermined period and are activated each time you visit Our Site.

4.1.7 Session Cookies

Any of the above types of Cookie may be a session Cookie. Session Cookies are temporary and only remain on your computer or device from the point at which you visit Our Site until you close your browser. Session Cookies are deleted when you close your browser.

5.1 The following first party Cookies may be placed on your computer or device:

Name of Cookie	Purpose & Type	Retention
PHPSESSID	This cookie is set by the PHP server hosting the website and is used to allocate resources and maintain security and continuity with users' sessions.	User session
trackshare	This cookie is set by the Exchange House website and is used to store user preferences regarding cookie settings specifically on this website.	30 days

5.2 The following third party Cookies may be placed on your computer or device:

yt-player-headers-readable	The yt-player-headers-readable cookie is used by YouTube to store user preferences related to video playback and interface, enhancing the user's viewing experience.	YouTube	Never
ytidb::LAST_RESULT_ENTRY_KEY	The cookie ytidb::LAST_RESULT_ENTRY_KEY is used by YouTube to store the last search result entry that was clicked by the user. This information is used to improve the user experience by providing more relevant search results in the future.	YouTube	Never
yt-player-bandwidth	The yt-player-bandwidth cookie is used to store the user's video player preferences and settings, particularly related to bandwidth and streaming quality on YouTube.	YouTube	Never
yt-remote-session-app	The yt-remote-session-app cookie is used by YouTube to store user preferences and information about the interface of the embedded YouTube video player.	YouTube	User session
yt-remote-cast-installed	The yt-remote-cast-installed cookie is used to store the user's video player preferences using embedded YouTube video.	YouTube	User session
yt-remote-session-name	The yt-remote-session-name cookie is used by YouTube to store the user's video player preferences using embedded YouTube video.	YouTube	User session
yt-remote-cast-available	The yt-remote-cast-available cookie is used to store the user's preferences regarding whether casting is available on their YouTube video player.	YouTube	User session

yt-remote-fast-check-period	The yt-remote-fast-check-period cookie is used by YouTube to store the user's video player preferences for embedded YouTube videos.	YouTube	User session
YSC	YSC cookie is set by Youtube and is used to track the views of embedded videos on Youtube pages.	YouTube	User session
VISITOR_INFO1_LIVE	A cookie set by YouTube to measure bandwidth that determines whether the user gets the new or old player interface.	YouTube	6 months
yt-remote-device-id	YouTube sets this cookie to store the video preferences of the user using embedded YouTube video.	YouTube	Never
yt-remote-connected-devices	YouTube sets this cookie to store the video preferences of the user using embedded YouTube video.	YouTube	Never
IDE	Google DoubleClick IDE cookies are used to store information about how the user uses the website to present them with relevant ads and according to the user profile.	Google	1 year, 24 days, 1 minute
yt.innertube::requests	YouTube sets this cookie to register a unique ID to store data on what videos from YouTube the user has seen.	YouTube	Never
yt.innertube::nextId	YouTube sets this cookie to register a unique ID to store data on what videos from YouTube the user has seen.	YouTube	Never

5.3 The analytics service(s) used by Our Site use(s) the following analytics Cookies:

Name of Cookie	Purpose & Type	Provider	Retention
_ga _utma _utmb _utmc _utmt _utmz	These cookies, installed by Google Analytics, calculate visitor, session, campaign data, and also keep track of site usage for the site's analytics report. The cookies store information anonymously and assign a randomly generated number to recognise unique visitors.	Google	User session

6.1 Before Cookies are placed on your computer or device, you will be shown as a

pop up requesting your consent to set those Cookies. By giving your consent to the placing of Cookies you are enabling Us to provide the best possible experience and service to you. You may, if you wish, deny consent to the placing of Cookies unless those Cookies are strictly necessary; however certain features of Our Site may not function fully or as intended. You will be given the opportunity to allow and/or deny different categories of Cookie

- 6.2 In addition to the controls that We provide, you can choose to enable or disable Cookies in your internet browser. Most internet browsers also enable you to choose whether you wish to disable all Cookies or only third party Cookies. By default, most internet browsers accept Cookies but this can be changed.
